The Reformation: Sola Scriptura

This year, marks 507 years of the Reformation. The reformation emphasized "Sola Christus, Sola Gratias, Sola Fide, Sola Scriptura, and Soli Deo Gloria". What does this mean? "We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, on account of Christ alone, to God be all glory."

Beginning with the New Year's Eve Service on December 31st, our congregation will embark upon a year-long journey through the Bible. With this in mind, we explore "Sola Scriptura".

As Lutherans, we are "Sola Scriptura". Which means that everything that we believe, teach, and confess is based upon the Holy Scriptures. This stands in contrast to the emphasis upon tradition or reason/emotion.

To this day, the Roman Catholic church places a strong emphasis upon tradition. They place it on par with the scriptures. In the time of the Reformation, the supported the selling of indulgences.

They taught that there was a treasure trove of good works earned by the great saints of old. In exchange for a certain amount of money, the Pope would grant this merit unto either yourself or a loved one. This reduced the amount of time a person would spend in purgatory, prior to entering into heaven. This practice was known as the sale of indulgences.

The problem with this teaching is that there is no scriptural basis for the practice. Therefore, where scripture was silent, tradition spoke. The church of the 1500's leaned upon the authority of tradition to teach the sale of indulgences and terrify consciences of the fires of hell. However, the sale of indulgences not only wasn't found in scripture, it actually contradicted scripture. It had to be rejected.

We do value and practice tradition, but when the tradition contradicts scripture or is harmful to the teachings of the faith, it must be rejected. Tradition can serve to amplify, confess, and express the teachings of the scriptures, but must not rule or contradict the scriptures.

On the other side of the spectrum, some hold reason or emotion above the scriptures. For example, when Jesus says of the bread "This is my body" and of the wine, "this is my blood". They conclude that on account of reason, Jesus must not mean what he is saying. They conclude that the bread represents the body, and the wine represents the blood. The text does not give any indicator that this is meant to be taken metaphorically. However, many still jump to this conclusion. Why? Because when reason rules, it dictates Jesus' body can not be on every altar around the world. Therefore the bread and wine are a representation, they conclude.

Standing upon reason and emotions seems nice for a while, but it robs us of the wondrous gifts of Baptism and the Lord's Supper in which our God strengthens and sustains our faith. For the sake of the grace that our God so deeply desires to deliver to you, we stand upon scripture alone.

Reason, emotions, and tradition are all good things. However, they should seek to serve the truth of God's word, not rule over it. Therefore, since we confess "Sola Scriptura", we shall spend time in the word of God as a congregation. We will read through the Bible together.

Why as a congregation? Because while our confession comes from Scripture alone, we learn it together. Most of the letters of the New Testament were written to entire groups of people, to be read together as a church.

As a pastor, I have been blessed to lead many Bible studies. In those studies, I do not rely upon my knowledge alone. I've learned from so many different teachers of the Bible; they brought out aspects of the scriptures that I haven't noticed. I have also learned from Bible Study attendees. They may find something within a passage that I may not have noticed. We don't learn the Bible in complete isolation.

While it is good practice to read the Bible on our own, it is also good to learn alongside others. To learn from experienced teachers, who have wrestled with the scriptures. Therefore, I look forward to walking this journey together as a congregation. We will learn and grow together in the scriptures that our God has written for us. In Christ,


