



READING Isaiah 49:1–7

L A reading from Isaiah, chapter 49.

¹Listen to me, O coastlands, and give attention, you peoples from afar. The LORD called me from the womb, from the body of my mother he named my name. ²He made my mouth like a sharp sword: in the shadow of his hand he hid me: he made me a polished arrow; in his guiver he hid me away. ³And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." ⁴But I said, "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my right is with the LORD, and my recompense with my God." ⁵And now the LORD says, he who formed me from the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him: and that Israel might be gathered to him for I am honored in the eyes of the LORD, and my God has become my strength— 6he says: "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to bring back the preserved of Israel; I will make you as a light for the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." ⁷Thus says the LORD. the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One, to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nation. the servant of rulers: "Kings shall see and arise; princes, and they shall prostrate themselves: because of the LORD, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you."


READING Luke 2:22–32

L A reading from Luke, chapter 2.

²²When the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, [Mary and Joseph] brought [Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³(as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons." ²⁵Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was

Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

- ³⁰for my eyes have seen your salvation
 - ³¹that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,
- 32a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel."

- C But now in these last days, He has spoken to us by His Son.







The congregation's response may begin just as the leader's petition ends so that the word "Lord" is sung simultaneously by both leader and congregation.




